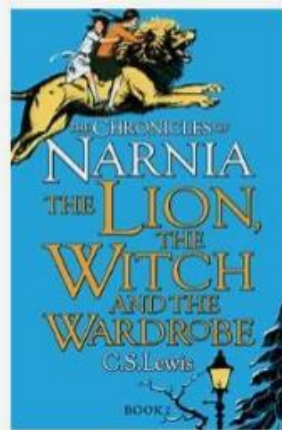

Science

Sound

- Know how sounds are made (vibration).
- Know what happens to a sound as it travels and reaches our ear.

Electricity

- Conductors allow electricity to pass through- Such as copper, iron and steel.
- Insulators do not allow electricity to pass through them- Such as plastic, wood, glass and rubber.
- An electrical circuit consists of a cell or battery connected to a component using wires.
- Metals are good conductors so they can be used as wires in a circuit.
- Non-metallic solids are insulators except for graphite (pencil lead). Water, if not completely pure, also conducts electricity.

History

Local History – Daresbury and Norton Priory

- 1134 Norton Priory founded.
- 1536 Norton Priory closed due to Henry VIII Dissolution of the Monasteries
- 1600 Daresbury Grammar School founded during reign of Queen Elizabeth I
- 1870 All Saint's Church rebuilt-only old bell tower survived.
- 1877 Daresbury Board School completed.
- 1914 - 1918 WWI
- 1920 War Memorial erected in All Saint's churchyard.
- 1941 omen's Land Army moved into Daresbury House
- 1939 – 1945
- WWII The name Daresbury comes from the Anglo-Saxon DEOR'S BURGH, meaning Deor's stronghold.
- Henry VIII reformed the church for various reasons, and this meant that Norton Priory was closed.

Geography

Volcanoes and Earthquakes.

- The earth is made up of different layers; crust; mantle; core.
- The earth is covered in tectonic plates which are constantly moving.
- The point on the Earth's surface at the centre of an Earthquake is called the epicentre.
- Earthquakes occur when tension is released from inside the crust.
- An earthquake is the shaking and vibration of the Earth's crust due to movement of the Earth's plates (plate tectonics).
- On land, volcanoes form when one tectonic plate moves under another.
- A volcano connects magma from the earth's crust to the earth's surface.
- Magma is molten rock – rock that is so hot it has turned into a liquid.
