Key Vocabulary

port	A landing place for ships on a coast, river, or lake.
global gateway	Stands for sustainable and trusted connections that work for people and the planet.
fair trade	Fair trade means that fair prices are paid to producers. The trade is between developed and developing countries.
economy	How a country or place is doing in making goods, and how much money it has.
resources	Something that can be used for a purpose.
injustices	Violation of right or of the rights of another: unfairness.
globalisation	The increasing connections between places and people across the planet.
distribution	Giving or delivering them to a number of people or places.
